

**CELEBRATION OF HEROES**

Presentations were made to Sergeant Mark Bennett, Constable Cory Courtney and Constable Gary Walton from Shelburne Police, Jason Dzikowski and Dustyn Paton of Dufferin Paramedic Service and Shelburne

District Firefighters for their quick-thinking and heroic actions.

On the evening of December 6, 2012, Rena Pasco, a 44-year-old Shelburne resident was running some errands when she suddenly fell unconscious while sitting in the passenger seat of her car.

Her boyfriend, who was driving the vehicle at the time, immediately stopped and ran into the Shelburne police station in search for help. The police officers on duty immediately without hesitation responded to her side, equipped with the new public access defibrillator and notified allied emergency 911 services.



After a quick assessment the patient was found to be vital signs absent and CPR was started immediately. The public access defibrillator was applied and one shock was delivered to the unconscious and unresponsive patient. Emergency services arrived within minutes, both Fire and Paramedics attended. Ms. Pascoe recovered from the incident and attended the Council meeting to give her thanks to their quick-thinking.

## REQUEST FOR EASEMENT ALONG FORMER RAIL BY DUFFERIN WIND

Dufferin Wind Power is requesting an easement along the former County-owned rail line to install a 230 kV transmission line to connect with a Wind Farm Project in Melancthon. Council received a report from the MMM Group with comments on a review of the application by Dufferin Wind for approval of the Renewal Energy Application and a report from the Chief Administrative Officer incorporating comments received at a public meeting held on February 5, 2013 and other comments received through the process.



The proposed transmission line would run from Melancthon through a private easement, along the rail corridor in Shelburne, and Amaranth to an existing transformer station in Orangeville.

Council directed staff to submit comments to the Ministry of the Environment which would include:

- Additional Studies and Reviews identified by the MMM Group
- Items for Clarification and additional information identified by the MMM Group
- Clarification of items raised by staff
- A summary of general types of comments received from residents
- Copies of all correspondence received from residents on this matter (both negative and positive)
- Request for a moratorium on all wind development until the health studies currently being conducted (Two Year Health Canada Study on Wind Turbine Noise and Health) is completed and shared.
- Objection to any overhead lines that will connect with any wind development projects in Dufferin County.
- Requests that any transmissions lines, if approved, be located underground and not located in the Town of Shelburne.
- Concerns and questions from Dufferin County residents and interested parties be responded to by the Ministry of the Environment prior a decision being made on the Dufferin Wind Project.

## **FORMER STANTON HOTEL UPDATE**

Mr. Carl Tafel provided an update to Council on the proposed relocation of the former Stanton Hotel located at Airport Road and 5<sup>th</sup> Sideroad of Mulmur. Mr. Tafel requested consideration of moving the building to the Museum property and reported that the group CASSH (Community Association to Save the Stanton Hotel) is applying for Trillium funding to assist with the costs to re-locate the building.

Council approved the concept of moving the structure to the Museum property in principle and directed staff to prepare a report regarding feasibility and prepare a business case for staffing and operational costs if the building was located on the Museum grounds.

## **SPEED LIMIT REDUCED AT AIRPORT ROAD AND HWY 9**



Council approved the reduction of the speed limit on Airport Road 200 meters north of Highway 9. Upon review of the area, staff have determined that a posted 60 km/hr zone should commence at the intersection of County Road #18/Highway #9 and continue north for an approximate distance of 200 m to allow for traffic to acknowledge the reduction prior to entering the adjacent commercial area.

## **ATV CLUB REQUEST TO USE FORMER RAIL CORRIDOR – SHELBURNE TO ORANGEVILLE**

The Dufferin Grey ATV Club is requesting use of the former rail corridor from Orangeville to Shelburne on a trial basis and continued use of the northern part of the rail line. Council has directed staff to seek comments from the Township of Amaranth, the Dufferin OPP and the Grand River Conservation Authority regarding the request and report back to committee.
