## MINISTRY OF HEALTH AND LONG TERM CARE FUNDING ANNOUNCEMENT

In July, Dufferin Oaks received notice from the Ministry of Health and Long Term Care of long term care home funding envelope increases. The Nursing and Personal Care Envelope and the Program and Support Services Envelope were increased retroactively to April 1, 2013. The Raw Food Envelope and the Other Accommodation Envelope was increased effective July 1, 2013.

# **NUISANCE COYOTE BY-LAW**

The Ministry of Natural Resources has changed the way that it authorizes municipalities to compensate individuals for the hunting and trapping of coyotes. As of July 1, 2013, municipalities are no longer required to obtain a specific authorization from their local ministry office in order to compensate hunters. This change enables municipalities to continue to compensate licensed hunters for the coyote predation control program without special authorization from the MNR in accordance with the rules under the Fish and Wildlife Conservation Act. Council directed staff to consult with the Dufferin Federal of Agriculture for proposed solutions to the killing of livestock by coyotes with a view to creating a new coyote compensation process and report back to Committee.
