If Dufferin County could have a park where it was fenced in so that I could enjoy being at the park with all my children without the fear of my child running away or running out onto the street, that would be a dream come true. The world is ready willing and able to accommodate wheelchairs, the blind, the deaf and all sorts of other disabilities. However, when it comes to intellectual disabilities, people who have no awareness of danger, like autism for example, there is no place for them in Dufferin County. So you see we spend most of our time in a home where it is safe or traveling to different jurisdictions that can provide some type of programming that will keep our children safe and engaged.
