The nominee:

-  Designs indoor/outdoor environments and experiences that engage children in active, creative and meaningful exploration, play and inquiry
-  Is aware of the many “languages” children use to communicate and provides them with individualized support and opportunity so children of all abilities can express themselves and be heard
-  Uses documentation to make children’s thinking, learning, and competence visible to children, families and others
-  Continuously questioning and testing their own theories and strategies, seeking new ideas to facilitating children’s exploration and understanding of the world around them in meaningful ways
