Land Acknowledgement Statement

We also acknowledge that various municipalities within the County of Dufferin reside within the treaty lands named under the Haldimand Deed of 1784 and two of the Williams Treaties of 1818: Treaty 18: the Nottawasaga Purchase, and Treaty 19: The Ajetance Treaty.









Where We Are Now

Dufferin County's Greenhouse Gas Inventory (2016)






Dufferin's GHG Reduction Targets
