Land Acknowledgement

We respectfully acknowledge that Dufferin County resides within the traditional territory and ancestral lands of the Tionontati (Petun), Attawandaron (Neutral), Haudenosaunee (Six Nations), and Anishinaabe peoples.

We also acknowledge that various municipalities within the County of Dufferin reside within the treaty lands named under the Haldimand Deed of 1784 and two of the Williams Treaties of 1818: Treaty 18: the Nottawasaga Purchase, and Treaty 19: The Ajetance Treaty.

Itinerary: The rolling pastoral hills of Mulmur are home to some wonderful hidden gems, like the **Rosemont General Store**, built in 1861 and full of character. Pop into this historic shop to have a bite at the cafe, or stock up on organic, locally sourced products and homemade treats.

Your next destination is the **Museum of Dufferin**, housed in a huge green barn with a red roof that you can't miss. Inside you'll find historic buildings that you can explore, exhibitions, and more than 18,000 artefacts that tell the story of Dufferin County's past.

Arts & Culture

Itinerary: Orangeville's historic main street, Broadway, is full of small-town charm and easy to explore on foot. Start your walking tour with a bite at the popular **Pia's on Broadway** for carefully crafted meals that use fresh, local ingredients. Then it's time to enjoy strolling through town, where red bricked heritage buildings that line the boulevard are now home to art galleries like **Dragonfly Arts** and **Maggiolly**, unique boutiques like **Pear Home**, charming thrift stores, book shops, and a plethora of bakeries, patisseries, restaurants and cafes.



As you explore around you're sure to notice the Art Walk of Trees, a public art installation of incredible hand carved tree sculptures, and many large murals showcasing the rich history of Orangeville. Take time to poke around in quirky furnishing shop **Blumen**, stained-glass specialist **Glasscraft**, and **Sproule's Emporium** with fair trade goodies from all over the world.







Catch a live show at **Theatre Orangeville**, where professional theatre wows audiences in the stately Opera House, followed by dinner at **RustiK Local Bistro** for authentic locally sourced food. Be sure to sample some local wines, craft beers and ciders from their drinks list, made right here in Dufferin County.

HISTORIC DRIVING TOURS OF DUFFERIN COUNTY

MUSEUM OF DUFFERIN

Enjoy this snippet from a historic driving tour of Mulmur and Melancthon! Please note that the Museum of Dufferin historic driving tours feature European settler points of interest.

These landmarks were built on the traditional territory and ancestral lands of the Tionontati (Petun), Attawandaron (Neutral), Haudenosaunee (Six Nations), and Anishinaabe peoples.

STOP 1

Starting at the Museum of Dufferin, turn right onto Airport Road and continue north through the villages of Stanton and Mansfield. The Village of Mansfield is named for the "manse in the field" - the home of Rev. Alexander Colqhoun. Continue North on Airport Road and make a left on River Road, heading towards Terra Nova.

The Mansfield General store was once a busy meeting point for locals! (P-1059 Museum of Dufferin Collection, ca. 1900)

STOP 2

In the 1880s this part of Mulmur was "discovered" by lumbermen and sawyers who cleared the area of trees. The village of Terra Nova (Latin for "new land") was founded as a lumber camp. Continue straight along the road. You will pass Kilgorie and the Pine River Fishing area.

STOP 3

At the stop sign, pause to look around the village of Horning's Mills, named for the seven mills that once operated along the banks of the Boyne and Pine Rivers that run through the village. Take a tour around and you'll find the Horning's Mills community hall and beautiful historic homes.

Horning's Mills has always been known for their enthusiasm for baseball, pictured here is the women's baseball team in 1929. (P-1444 B)


