(i.e. COVID, cost of living, etc.) ○ Criminal activity – still a top priority, work more closely with Dufferin OPP to link the work they do • The group noted links between priorities identified in the survey results and current action/strategic plans <p>Proposed Next Steps:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1.
